

11	Yardley Road, Acocks Green Police Station	Red brick and terracotta; tile roof. Two-storeys. Almost symmetrical elevation to Yardley Road. Central section with rusticated ground floor above which is a central pedimented bay with flanking projecting bays with segmental pediments. To either side are two-storey canted bays. Sliding sash windows throughout. On corner with Alexander Road is an octagonal turret with lead dome and keyed ocular windows. Low boundary wall with moulded terracotta coping.	c.1911	B
12	Yardley Road, Acocks Green Baptist Church and Hall	Church of red/brown brick and stone; tiled roof. Symmetrical Arts and Crafts style elevation. Tall central window with stone tracery in an angular perpendicular style over an arched entrance set between two octagonal towers with louvred caps. Two-storey wings to each side with high mullioned windows; leaded lights.	Church 1913 by F B Andrews for Baptist Chapel Trustees Hall 1924 for Baptist Church	A
		Hall of red/brown brick; tile roof. Single-storey. Occupies corner site. Entrance front of asymmetrical composition with recessed door in arched opening with half-timbered gable above. Side elevation of three bays; five windows in the rhythm 1:3:1. Symmetrical composition with tall gabled bays at each end containing recessed bow windows set between brick piers under a half timber gable. Steep roof topped by Arts and Crafts style femerell with three hipped dormers. Casement windows with glazing bars throughout.

1	Alexander Road, Acocks Green Fire Station	Red brick and buff terracotta; tile roof. Single-storey; two bays, the right hand bay set forward and containing a pair of tall, half-glazed doors set in a flat arched opening with bold keystone, all under a brick and terracotta striped gable bearing the words "Fire Station" in raised terracotta letters. The left hand bay is lower and contains a doorway and single window.	C.1911	B
2	Alexander Road, Acocks Green Baptist Church Hall and Caretaker's House	Hall of red brick and terracotta; tiled roof. Two-storeys; three bays, in a loosely Flemish Gothic style. Main facade is symmetrical with a central gabled bay which projects slightly. Central door set in richly moulded terracotta surround flanked by tall windows with transoms and mullions topped by trefoil heads. On the first floor a segmental headed window with transoms and simple tracery spans the width of the bay. Above the words "Baptist Church Hall" are set into a terracotta panel on the shaped gable above. The side bays have tall ground floor windows with transoms, mullions and simple tracery. First floor windows with mullions under an enriched terracotta eaves cornice. All windows with leaded lights. The elevation is terminated at each side by a short, hexagonal terracotta turret with moulded eaves cornice topped by a copper dome.	Hall 1903 Caretaker's House	A
3	Birmingham Road, Sutton Coldfield Odeon Cinema	Caretaker's house to right-hand side. Two-storeys, two window front. Canted bay to right on ground floor with lead roof. Timber casements throughout. "Art Deco" cinema with tall fin-like tower bearing neon "Odeon" letters on side and vertical neon strips on face towards road. Elevation of auditorium towards Maney Corner has square faience panels and vertical strips of windows. To right of tower is entrance canopy into lower faience clad blocks with curved corners.
